John Adams was no stranger to Holbrook. Elihu, his younger brother, resided in present day Holbrook and his home was located on South Franklin St. He was Captain of the Braintree Company at the siege of Boston and died in Cambridge 8/10/1775. Elihu Adams is buried at Union Cemetery, Holbrook.
